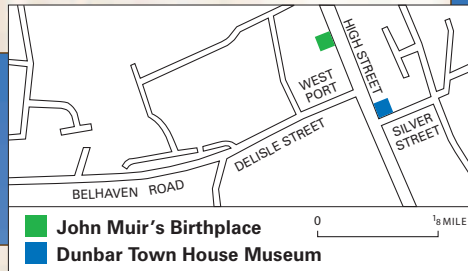

There is level access to the Visitor Centre, Power House and across the site; there are steps up to and within the Beam Engine House.

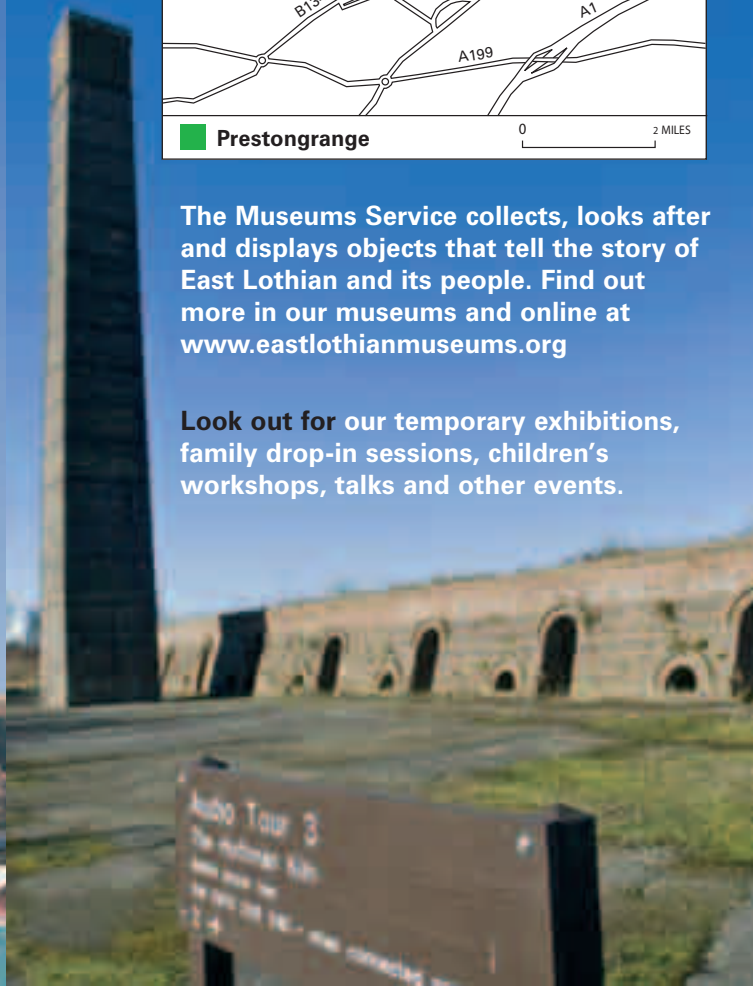
Toilets are in the Visitor Centre.

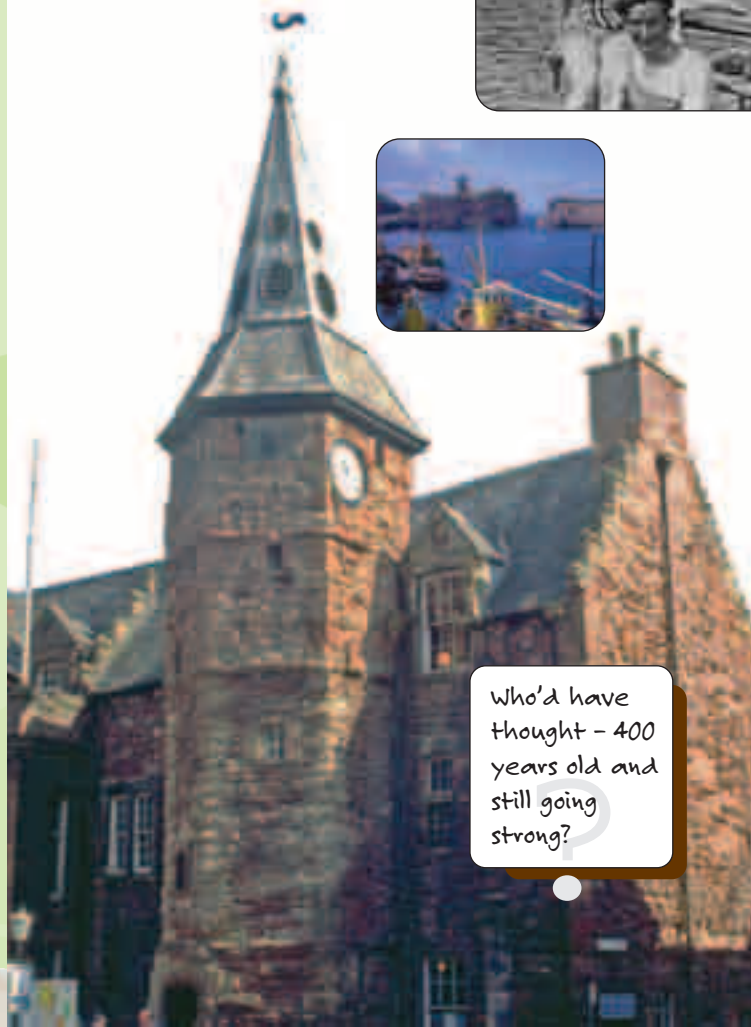
